The Town of Port au Port East extends best wishes to its residents for a Prosperous New Year and hopes that everyone will enjoy good health and prosperity in 2019. The following is an itemied list of accomplishments for our town in 2018 and also some points that Council would like to convey to you.

WATER

• For the past number of years, the goal was to provide an adequate amount of drinking water for our town. We have completed leak detections, repaired leaks as they were found, and recently installed a liner in the town's reservoir. The value of this project is as follows: Total Project Cost = 338,427 (Cost less GST Rebate = 306,897). Provincial Contribution = 276,208 and Municipal Contribution = 30,689. We would like to express our thanks to Mr. John Finn –MHA for the District of Port au Port for his assistance. Our reservoir is almost full of water at the present time.

We would like to inform residents however, that we do have a problem with a major valve at one of the chlorination buildings which is preventing us from using the well. Equipment is old and worn out and we are in the process of replacing and repairing parts as needed. Residents will experience lower than normal pressure until the well is put back on line again. Council is asking for your patience during this time.

SNOW

- Residents are asked not to place snow in ditches. This will help lessen the chances of flooding when there is heavy rain and especially in the spring.
- Please do not deposit snow out into the road when clearing your driveway. It is illegal and dangerous, and makes it difficult for people to get around.

BALLFIELD / WALKING TRACK

• Significant resources have been put into its upkeep and more work will be done in the Spring. Improvements are already attracting more walkers, Little League Baseball and continued use by St. Thomas Aquinas School.

HOMEOWNERS/LANDLORDS

- The Port au Port Regional Volunteer Fire Department is requesting that you provide a list of all people that are living in your home and /or any apartment on your property. In the event of an emergency (ie fire), the fire department needs to know how many people should be accounted for. BEACH CLEAN-UP

• The Towns of Port au Port East and Port au Port West, Aguathuna, Felix Cove **jointly** sponsored a (50/50 cost shared) cleanup of the area of beach on the fishing shed side and below the RC Cemetary. A gate was installed to hopefully deter people from littering in this area. A total of 12,000.00 was spent.

GENERATOR

• Council would like to inform residents that we are in the process of trying to acquire and install an emergency generator that will provide sufficient power to run our water system in the event of electricity failure. It is our plan to also provide enough power for a Warmup Centre at the Tourist Chalet in the event of extended multi-day power outages as we had experienced just a few years ago.

TOURIST CHALET/SUMMER PROJECTS

• Each year the Town (in conjunction with the Senior's 50+ Club) applies for funding from various sources: (Canada Summer Jobs, Advanced Education & Skills NL and Qualipu) to assist in the running of the Centre and give as many of our youth employment opportunities for as long as funding is available – usually 6-7 weeks each year. We also provide an opportunity for our Senior's to sell homemade crafts and to talk to our Students about the amount of work involved in the different projects. Ie: jams, quilts and paintings. The town supports our Senior's in any way that it can ie: lawnmowing, snow clearing and any office assistance as required.

PORT AU PORT REGIONAL VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT BACKGROUND

In 2011-2012, the Towns of Port au Port East and Port au Port West-Aguathuna-Felix Cove collaborated and formed one regional fire department, called the Port au Port Regional Volunteer Fire Department. The goal was to provide fire services to both Towns and offer outlying communities coverage based on a fee for service. These outlying communities are Campbell's Creek, Point au Mal and Fox Island River. Forming one Fire Department involved many changes and re-organization. We currently have twenty-six firefighters and provide the following services, Defensive/Offensive Firefighting in our area of responsibility and Vehicle Extrication to the Port au Port Peninsula. We also have mutual aid agreements with the Lourdes and Cape St George Fire Departments

TRAINING: Depart of 11 to 12 to the second of the second of the second gradient color district of 2 Carried out every Sunday afternoon for three hours. Members of the fire department participated in scenariobased training exercises throughout the year as well. All firefighters must complete Minimum Training Standards before attending a fire. In addition, all members received Standard First Aid, Level C CPR/AED training. This year five firefighters were trained in Pet First Aid, three in Vehicle Extrication and two in Assisting Individuals in Crisis and Group Crisis Intervention. (Critical Stress Debriefer)

OPERATIONS:

Person o The fire department responded to twelve Emergency calls 2018, sixteen in 2017 and seventeen in 2016. We also conducted five building inspections 2018 and Fire drills at the school throughout the year

THE WAY AHEAD 2019 AND A SECOND SECON

Operation 2020 Fire and Emergency Services, Department of Municipal Affairs and Environment, will be coordinating a province wide, in-house, training program entitled "Operation 2020" using the new Essential 7 for Firefighting manual, which meets the requirements of NFPA 1001, Firefighter I, 2018 Edition, starting in January 2019.

The program will be delivered in-house by fire department training officers over a period of 14 months. To assist in the delivery of the training program, "Operation 2020", the International Fire Service Training Association, (IFSTA) has agreed to provide free access to ResourceOne, which is IFSTA's on-line learning management system. IFSTA will provide training to participating fire department training officers and permit free access to all of the new Essential 7 curriculum material. Our department has signed up for the program and will be very busy training this year.
